When God hears the Israelites grumbling and complaining, He does not give them the tongue lashing they so obviously deserve. God does not even chide them for their lack of faith. God responds by saying, "I will rain down bread from heaven for you (Exodus 16:4)". This is who God is to us. He is a God who rains down undeserved grace upon those who fear Him; upon those who walk in righteousness. He is a God who understands our weaknesses and frailties

As we work alongside each other, it is inevitable that conflict and misunderstanding will sometimes arise. It is inevitable that there will be some grumbling and complaining. The challenge is for us to extend that same measure of unmerited grace to others, especially to those who offend us, then we will shine like stars in the sky (Philippians 2:15).


